
Village rejects all bids for garage project

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Grafton — The village of Grafton's board decided unanimously to reject all bids and rebid its garage project at the Monday village board meeting.

The village received 12 bids ranging from \$2.67 million to \$3.54 million for the project, but all of the bids exceeded the budgeted amount of \$2,567,900.

The village plans to re-bid the project to include a base bid for the garage building and an alternative bid for the septage-receiving facility, the second part of the project.

The new two-level, 96,000-square-foot

storage facility will house all of the village's water utility vehicles and other equipment, according to Jon Wallenkamp with Kueny Architects.

The new building will replace three existing aging buildings on the site, including an incinerator building, existing vehicle storage building and a smaller garage that was home to a sewage treatment plant many years ago.

Wallenkamp's firm also worked on the village's public works building.

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
